My Words Have Power Leader's Guide

Engaging one another: Talk about a time someone cheered you on in a game or cheered you up when you were down. How did that make you feel?

Engaging God:

- Through Worship

John 15:13 NLT *There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends.*

Give the children an opportunity to thank God for what He has done for them this week. If some of them can't think of anything, remind them of all that God does each day.

- Through Prayer

1 John 5:14-1 NIV *This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him.*

Give each of the children an opportunity to pray. Talk to the children about prayer; that when they pray they are talking to a friend. It's just that this friend created the universe and that's why it's important to show respect to Him. Talk with them about how they would feel as a friend if someone only talked to them when they needed something. Remind them that although God loves to hear from us about our needs, it's also important to Praise God for who He is, ask God to help others, and thank God for hearing our prayer.

Try a popcorn style prayer. Tell the children that you will open and close the prayer and give time in between for them to say something to God. Explain that it doesn't have to be anything special or big. They can just share something they're worried about or just thank God for something good in their lives.

-Through the Word

God's Word: Read the Bible verse Colossians 4:6. Proverbs is filled with wisdom and guidance for living a Christian life. Read Proverbs 12:18-22 to find out what God says about using encouraging speech to build one another up.

Discussion: To 'Speak Life' is to use our words in a loving, encouraging way. What does this passage say about our words? Talk about times when someone's words have hurt you or when you've hurt others with angry or harsh words.

Activities:

- Play a game to encourage one another. For example: write something positive about each child on a different sticky note. Read them one at a time and have the group guess who you are talking about. When they guess it, stick the notes on the correct person. Then have the children write encouraging notes about one another and take turns sticking them to each other.
- Play Telephone to remind children how rumors and gossip can be very hurtful.

-Scripture Meditation

Let your conversation be gracious and attractive.... Colossians 4:6

Start a challenge with a reward system for memory verses in your group. Find out how most of the children learn verses best. Some do well with hand motions or sign language, through songs or beats or art/drawing.

Explain the context of the verse so that the children understand how important it is to know God's word.

Supplies: Crayons/Paper

Activity: Have the children write out the verse on a sheet of paper. Pray with them asking that the Holy Spirit reveal the truth of this verse. Give the children 5-10 minutes to draw pictures and/or write words about what God is sharing with them. After they have time to color/draw/write, have the children explain what God has shared with them.

***If children explain the pictures in ways that are not Biblical (lovingly), help them understand what the verse means.**

Engaging the World:

Isaiah 58:7 NL *Share your food with the hungry, and give shelter to the homeless. Give clothes to those who need them, and do not hide from relatives who need your help.*

What's your next step? Baptism? Serving? Inviting a friend? Using your gifts? Think about it. Pray about it. Next week, share with the group what your next step will be.

Pray for someone in your life who doesn't know Jesus. Draw them a picture, or write them a letter letting them know that God loves them.
