What Is Love

March 29, 2015

Recite 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 as able. Read the verse out loud together. What has stood out to you most from this passage during this series?

Are you more likely to not commit enough or over commit? How does that usually work out? Are you more likely to make commitments that you don't keep or fulfill nearly every commitment you make? How does this impact you and others?

Read 1 Corinthians 13:7 again and 2 Corinthians 5:13-16. Love is commitment. Share about someone who has demonstrated this kind of committed love in your life. Who have you loved this way? Why?

Love can cause ridiculous things to happen. Discuss the reality that Jesus left Heaven to come and die for us. Compare and contrast His love for us and the way we love God and love others? Who needs you to love them like Jesus loves you right now? How can that begin to happen? Who needs you to bring them to Easter services? What can you do to see that happen?

Read Mark 11:1-6. Discuss this passage. What things stand out? The disciples didn't likely understand Jesus' request but in faith did as He asked. Share a time you stepped out in faith without full understanding but saw God show up.

What do you need to "untie" in your life so that God can release more in you and through you?

Read 1 Corinthians 13:13. The greatest thing in life is love. Love never fails. What changes can you make so this can be the life you live? How can the group help?

Pray to be filled with God's love and to live out the commitments to love others. Pray together that God would reveal areas in our lives that we can untie and watch God release power through.
