



Mark 10:17-22 NLT As Jesus was starting out on his way to Jerusalem, a man came running up to him, knelt down, and asked, “Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?”¹⁸ “Why do you call me good?” Jesus asked. “Only God is truly good.”¹⁹ But to answer your question, you know the commandments: ‘You must not murder. You must not commit adultery. You must not steal. You must not testify falsely. You must not cheat anyone. Honor your father and mother.’”²⁰ “Teacher,” the man replied, “I’ve obeyed all these commandments since I was young.”²¹ Looking at the man, Jesus felt genuine love for him. “There is still one thing you haven’t done,” he told him. “Go and sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.”²² At this the man’s face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Proverbs 10:22 NLT The blessing of the Lord makes a person rich, and he adds no sorrow with it.

1 Timothy 6:10 NLT For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows.

Proverbs 12:11 NLT A hard worker has plenty of food, but a person who chases fantasies has no sense.

Proverbs 3:9-10 ESV Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce;¹⁰ then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine.

Matthew 23:23 ESV Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others.

Proverbs 11:24-25 NLT Give freely and become more wealthy; be stingy and lose everything.²⁵ The generous will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed.

Proverbs 10:4 NLT Lazy people are soon poor; hard workers get rich.

Philippians 4:11 NLT Not that I was ever in need, for I have learned how to be content with whatever I have.
